

Transformational Leadership in High Reliability Organizations





Mike is a highly decorated, experienced leader, former admiral, and corporate CEO who teaches others to lead and coaches teams to reach their potential. He draws inspiration from his father, a World War II Navy pilot who was killed deploying to the Korean War. Eighteen months after graduating college, Mike was flying combat missions under the mentorship of one of the original instructors of the real "Top Gun" Navy fighter weapons school, shooting down MiGs together. He later became the Executive Officer of the school, and eventually consulted for the hit movie "Top Gun".

Mike has command experience at every operational level of the Navy, including the Commander of the US 3rd Fleet. In these commands, he was able to achieve excellence while suffering no operational loss of life. His combat decorations include the Silver Star and Distinguished Flying Cross. Mike also served as the Director of Air Warfare for the Navy with oversight to the entire Naval Aviation budgets. He was serving in this capacity in the Pentagon when the 9/11 terrorist attack struck the building directly below his office. During that tour,

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he was largely responsible for the next generation of naval aviation technology, aircraft and aircraft carriers. Following Navy retirement, he became the CEO/President of a large commercial charter airline. He grew the airline into a multi-hundred-million-dollar business. He left the airline and retired a second time to battle cancer. Having survived air combat, the 9/11 attacks, and cancer, Mike embodies the spirit of "Glad To Be Here" and lives in a "pay it forward mode" bringing his storied experience and passion to helping teams and leaders.

Learning objectives:

After attending this presentation, attendees will learn to:

- Drive continuous improvement in healthcare environment from quality, safety and service
 delivery that will directly influence the patient experience. This presentation will define a
 framework that drives self responsibility, team focused outcomes, and ongoing review of
 process that results in continuous improvement.
- Foster the proper team dynamics and employee engagement to increase productivity, improve recruitment and retention of of employees and provide the right environment for development. This presentation will outline the key components found in high performing teams that create, implement and sustain a higher level of performance compared to environments where these components are missing. The presentation will also provide a way to measure current status to create a gap analysis.
- Define a quality assurance process that deemphasizes fault finding and highlights best practices to reinforce positive behavior. The debrief dynamics becomes a positive versus a negative experience which then will translate into the improvement of delivery of services.

It's Fluoro Time! 2019 TJC Requirements From Standards To Practice

John Harvey, Ph.D., DABR, CHP

Dr. Harvey is a board-certified diagnostic medical and health physicist for West Physics. Prior to joining the organization, Dr. Harvey completed his Ph.D. at the University of Michigan in health physics. His research focused on the deployment of thermoluminescent radiation dosimeters in non-ideal conditions. He has also participated in research into the computer-aided analysis of mammography and lung CT imaging, which can provide radiologists with a computerized second opinion for cancerous lesions.

During his tenure at West Physics, Dr. Harvey has surveyed numerous types of fluoroscopes; developed and delivered fluoroscopy radiation safety lectures and hands-on training in hospitals nationwide; counseled physicians on their fluoroscopy use during diagnostic and treatment procedures; performed patient, worker, and fetal dose calculations; investigated radiation overexposures; and has served or currently serves as Radiation Safety Officer for a Level 1 Trauma Center, nationwide mobile nuclear medicine/PET providers, an international narcotics and explosives detector manufacturer, and an animal cancer research facility.

- Discuss safe practices that can be used by fluoroscopy (IR, Cath Lab, GI, etc.) staff to minimize radiation safety hazards
- Recognize radiation safety hazards and incidents that have been documented during fluoroscopy use

Crockett Bone is the Director of Imaging & Oncology for HCA Healthcare, the nation's leading provider of healthcare services with more than 30 million encounters a year. A Tennessee native, Bone is married with two active children and currently serves as a volunteer board member for the local recreational youth basketball league, and an educational advisory board member for Health Connect Partners Imaging and IT Conference.

In 1993, Crockett received an Associate of Applied Science in Radiology from Itawamba Community College in Fulton, MS and is a 2001 graduate of Austin Peay State University. Crockett went on to receive a graduate degree in Healthcare Administration from California Coast University in 2014.

Julie Ross, Director of Imaging Services at Mercy Hospital St Louis, completed her Radiologic Technology education through the US Army and went on to train in Interventional Radiology at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. She then worked at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, MD, within IR, before settling down in St Louis, MO. Julie has served in a variety of leadership roles within Mercy Hospital St Louis and currently serves as the Director of Imaging Services for two of the local Mercy hospitals and as the Imaging service line chairman, for the Mercy health system's 45 acute care and specialty hospitals.

Julie and her husband, David, have six children, ranging from ages 12 to 27 and one granddaughter. They enjoy the outdoors and are always planning their next camping or hiking adventure.

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Co-presenter Todd Russell

Todd Russell, Director of Medical Imaging and Radiation Oncology at Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center in Idaho Falls, Idaho. Has worked in Medical Imaging for 25+ years. Started as a volunteer transporter in a Radiology department. Worked the clerical side of Radiology in the File Room and Patient Registration while completing the Radiologic Technologist program in Salt Lake City, Utah. Continued to work as a registered technologist in X-ray, CT, and MRI.

Todd graduated from Weber State University in Ogden, Utah with an emphasis in Health Administration and Advanced Radiography. Technical training and education experiences created pathways to various management and leadership roles within the hospital and outpatient environments with HCA. These experiences have led to abundant opportunities working with staff and patients to find common ground around expectations and patient experience.

Co-presenter Jim Wall

Jim was a graduate of the Mercy Hospital School of Radiologic Technology, Oklahoma City, OK in 1967. Worked as an Imaging Director from 1967 - 1975 at Harris Methodist Hospital, Ft. Worth, TX. Gaston Memorial Hospital, Gastonia, N.C., and Mercy Hospital Key Biscayne, Miami, Fl. He joined E.I. DuPont Photo Products in 1975 as an Imaging Specialist, moving to Atlanta, GA. Jim relocated to Houston, TX in 1982 with DuPont as Territory Manager. Responsibilities with DuPont included product development and introduction to the market place, and the education and training of Sales Representatives across the Southwest. While in Houston as the Territory Manager he developed and grew the DuPont Market Share to over 42%, or over \$16M. Jim left DuPont in 1994 and returned to his first love, Radiology!

In March of 1994 Jim joined Kingwood Medical Center, Kingwood, TX, a 150 bed Community Hospital, performing approximately 34k tests a year. Today, 25 years later, Kingwood Medical Center Hospital has grown to 437 beds, and is in expansion mode every year, or so it seems. The Imaging Department sits within the same foot print as the original department, but is now performing 140k tests, and is the largest department in the hospital, with 140 employees.

The Imaging Staff and Department Leadership take pride in their resourcefulness, and the quality of care they give their patients. From IR Procedures, PICC lines, Cyro-ablations, Y-90 therapeutic procedures, to the bread and butter exams of Radiology. The patient comes first and foremost! Our livelihood depends on the repeat patient, that patient that feel like they were cared for and made to feel safe. The Imaging Staff at Kingwood Medical Center does that!
