Perspective from the Frontlines

Dr. Ruth Cassidy is a Senior Vice President of Clinical Support Services and Chief Pharmacy Officer at SBH Health System located in NYC. The Supply Chain Cybersecurity Dilemma: When Third Parties Become a Critical Risk



Mac McMillan, FHIMSS, LCHIME CEO Emeritus; CynergisTek, Inc.

Mac McMillan is Chief Executive Officer Emeritus. Mac McMillan is considered a thought leader in security, privacy, and compliance issues in healthcare from his 40-year career as a healthcare and government expert. After successfully founding and leading CynergisTek to become the top-ranked information security and privacy consulting firm focused on the healthcare IT industry he retired in August of 2019. He is recognized as a HIMSS Fellow, former Chair of the HIMSS Privacy & Security Steering committee, Work Group and Policy Task Force. He served on the CHIME Board of Advisors for AEHIS, the Most Wired Advisory Board, contributed to Healthcare's Cybersecurity Model for the Baldridge award and advised KLAS on defining its cybersecurity criteria. He has been an advisor, advocate, and role model to the HIT security community by sharing his passion to educate the industry on the importance of security since his retirement from the federal government in 2000. He is the recipient of the CHIME Foundation Industry Leader Award for career excellence, the Baldrige Foundation Award for Leadership Excellence in the Cybersecurity sector and the HIMSS John A Page Distinguished Fellows Service Award.

McMillan has been a thought leader in cybersecurity and privacy issues in healthcare for nearly 20 years and has been recognized for his many contributions. He was recognized by Health Data Management as one of the Top 50 influencers in health IT, by Becker's Hospital Review's lists of influential healthcare IT leaders by both its writers and readers, and named one of the top 10 health information security influencers by HealthInfoSecurity. He has served on several advisory boards, such as HIT Exchange HealthTech Industry, HealthInfoSecurity Editorial Advisory Board and Healthcare Innovations Advisory Board. He has impacted healthcare security through broadcast and literature. For nearly a decade, McMillan has been a media fixture as reporters seek him out to educate the broader healthcare and security industry on what is going on in security, why security is important, and the consequences of ignoring security. This has led to his contribution in hundreds of articles, blog posts, podcasts, and news stories.
